## Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> May, 2017


• The **author**, **Stuart Reid** will visit school. Pupils will take part in a book-reading assembly and creative-writing workshop.

# Literacy

We will be beginning our new class novel, 'James and the Giant Peach'. It's the second novel by Roald Dahl that we'll be reading in class and we're sure that this will be another scrumdidilyumptious delight! If you've a copy of the novel at home, it'd be really helpful if you could bring it in to use in school. Thank you!



The focus of our work in punctuation this month will be the use of the **apostrophe**. We will be learning how to use the apostrophe to mark **contractions**. We will also learn how to use the apostrophe to show **possession**.

We will begin an interesting unit of work about **stories which raise issues**. We will identify social, moral or cultural issues in stories, e.g. the dilemmas faced by characters or the moral of the story. We will also become aware of / discuss how the characters deal with issues in stories. We will get to plan and write our own story which raises an issue / in which a character faces a dilemma.

In our **phonics** and spelling work, we'll be exploring different ways to write the **d**, **g / gh** and **m** sounds.

We'll keep working on our **joined handwriting** and continue to gain practise in using the **pen**.

### Numeracy

In Numeracy this month, we are:

- using grid-references;
- learning about co-ordinates;
- learning the eight points of the compass;
- exploring **clockwise** and **anti-clockwise turns** of 30°, 45°, 60°, 90°, 120°, 180° and 360°;
- **comparing** two **angles** to determine which is larger / smaller;
- **ordering** up to four **angles**, starting with the largest / smallest;
- revising odd and even numbers;
- working with **number sequences**;
- understanding and using multiples;
- understanding and using **negative numbers** in practical contexts;
- estimating, measuring and recording weight in g and kg;
- adding and subtracting common measures for weight;
- understanding the **relationship between metric units for weight**, e.g. 1kg = 1000g; and
- converting from one metric unit of weight to another, e.g. 4kg 125g = 4125g.

# Topic

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Our new and exciting topic is **Rainforests**. This month, we will:

- share what we know and would like to know about rainforests;
- be introduced to the sights and sounds of a rainforest environment;
- identify and discuss the **location** of rainforest areas;
- learn about the climate in a rainforest; and
- learn about the four **layers** that make up a rainforest.
