Our learning plan

Year Five – September, 2017

Literacy

We will be reading our class novel, 'Fantastic Mr.


Fox' and learning more about its author, Roald Dahl.

We'll write an acrostic poem about one of the characters.



Our focus for grammar and punctuation will be to revise the basic skills such as using **capital letters** and **full stops**. We will also take some time to complete work on **nouns**, **verbs** and **adjectives**.

In our phonics work we'll focus on different ways to write the 'oa', 'ow' and 'er' sounds. We are very excited that we will also be beginning joined handwriting this month!

Numeracy

In Numeracy this month, our work will include:

- revising multiplication and division by 2, 5 and 10;
- ensuring we have rapid and accurate recall of **number bonds** within 20:
- reading and writing number names within 1,000;
- revising our understanding of place value within 1,000;
- revising the written method for adding two three-digit numbers;
- interpreting pictograms, with the symbol representing more than 1 unit, and including the use of a 'part' symbol;
- identifying positions using grid references and co-ordinates.

Topic

We'll be learning about **Ancient Egypt.** We plan to:

- find out where Egypt is located;
- label features on a map of Ancient Egypt;
- find out about key dates in the chronology of Ancient Egypt;
- learn about hieroglyphics and have a go at creating our own cartouche;
- explore the Ancient Egyptian number system; and
- learn about the River Nile and its importance to the Ancient Egyptians.
