

Our visit to Omagh P.S.N.I. Station



Year Five had a very enjoyable, educational and entertaining visit to Omagh's P.S.N.I. Station, on Wednesday 8th November, 2017. We met police officers and got to learn about the work they do. We got a tour of this impressive building. We also got to see a range of police equipment and, in some cases, got to try on or use the resources for ourselves. We saw police vehicles and even got a spin in a landrover! We're sure you'll be glad to know that Shine, the mascot in Miss Eccles' class, eventually got released from these handcuffs! Our pupils were so well-behaved and we were very proud of you all.



Literacy

- We will be writing a **recount** of our visit to the Police Station.
- We are going to 'Read all about it!', as we read and respond to news stories.
 We will identify the main features of newspaper texts. We'll also have a go at writing newspaper style recounts.
- Our focus for grammar will be to look at verb tenses. In our punctuation work, we will explore the use of speech marks in writing.
- In our phonics work, we will be exploring ways that we can write the igh, oy, ue and aw sounds.
- We'll be continuing with joined handwriting, practising our formation of horizontal and diagonal joins.
- We will visit the school library every Friday. Don't forget to bring your book in, so you can return it and borrow a new one!

Topic Work

We will be continuing with our topic on **Ancient Egypt.** We will:

- explore what everyday life would have been like for the Ancient Egyptians;
- learn about Howard Carter and Lord Carnarvon's discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb;
- find out about Egyptian gods and goddesses; and
- learn more about Pharaohs.

What a busy and exciting month ahead!

Numeracy

 We will learn multiplication and division facts for the six times tables. We will also learn multiplication and division facts for the eight times tables.

We will complete work on **area**:

- introducing the square centimetre and the notation cm²;
- measuring and drawing shapes, with an area involving ½ cm²; and
- investigating drawing different shapes with the same area.

We will look at **number sequences to 10,000**, including finding the number after / before / between and 1, 2, 10, 50, 100 or 1000 more or less than

We will begin to learn about **fractions**:

- revising halves, quarters, tenths, thirds and fifths of shapes;
- introducing mixed numbers involving these fractions, for example 2½; and
- working on finding fractions of a number, such as one fifth and one tenth; linking this to our work on division.
