
Literacy

We will be reading our class novel, '**Fantastic Mr. Fox**' and learning more about its author, **Roald Dahl**. We'll write an **acrostic poem** about one of the characters.



Our focus for grammar and punctuation will be to revise the basic skills such as using **capital letters** and **full stops**. We will also take some time to complete work on **nouns**, **verbs** and **adjectives**.

In our phonics work we'll focus on different ways to write the '**oa**' and '**ow**' sounds. We are very excited that we will also be beginning **joined handwriting** this month!

Numeracy

In Numeracy this month, our work will include:

- revising **multiplication** and **division** by **2**, **3**, **4**, **5** and **10**;
- reading and writing **number names** within 10,000;
- learning about ordinal numbers;
- exploring mental strategies for addition to 100;
- exploring mental strategies for subtraction to 100;
- revising the sequence of **months** and the number of days in each month;
- learning how to read a calendar to identify the day, given the date, and vice-versa; and
- finding durations, in weeks or days, which 'bridge' consecutive months.

Topic

We'll be learning about **Ancient Egypt.** We plan to:

- name and identify the location of the world's continents;
- find out where Egypt is located;
- label features on a map of Ancient Egypt;
- find out about key dates in the chronology of Ancient Egypt;
- learn about hieroglyphics;
- have a go at creating a cartouche; and
- learn about the River Nile and its importance to the Ancient Egyptians.
